Reading Fluency

Reading fluency is a focus for many schools especially for pupils who have secured their phonics and decoding skills. This programme will give schools the knowledge needed to implement interventions.

The **Herts for Learning Reading Fluency Project** incorporates the strategies of modelled expressive reading, echo reading, repeated re-reading, skilled questioning, challenging text selection and modelling comprehension skills, to improve the trajectory of pupils towards the expected standard in reading.

Ican Talk Boost Training

Talk Boost is a highly successful early language intervention programme. The impact of the pandemic on children's language has been recognised, especially for disadvantaged pupils. Talk Boost can help accelerate children's early language through an achievable intervention programme.

This is a one day training programme for staff who are going to deliver the programme. A Talk Boost resource pack is also needed (costing about £200 from ICan) and is not included in the training - this needs to be bought by schools taking part.

Talk through stories

Talk Through Stories grows children's spoken vocabulary drawing on the best of children's literature. Developed by Read Write Inc using their extensive expertise it available to all schools, whatever their phonics programme.

This one day CPD will give teachers a comprehensive understanding of using stories to develop and support pupils' vocabulary and early language with a set of resources to reduce workload. It will be followed by a twilight session for schools to share how the programme has been implemented in their schools.

We have a limit of 20 schools taking part in this CPD – but groups of teachers will count as one booking. Schools will need to buy the books used in the programme.

Essential Spelling

We have commissioned this programme in response to many schools and teachers asking us what next for spelling!

The programme focuses on the teaching of spelling so that children understand how to apply patterns, strategies and knowledge to all words. It also provides links to prior knowledge and tracks back to related objectives so that teachers can give targeted support to children who are not yet able to spell words from their year group programme of study. In short, **ESSENTIAL spelling** enables children to become spellers for life, rather than remember spellings for a week.

The programme requires schools to buy a set of handbooks for the programme which cost around £240.
